

Understanding the users


To understand the users' feelings about the community, we started by conducting surveys, interviews and creating an empathy map. A primary user group identified through the research was the working adults who felt the need to attend events and connect with the community. The other user group identified were not socially active members who would like to be warned and aware of happenings in their locality.




If you need suggestions about things around your locality, Where do you go? 16 responses
